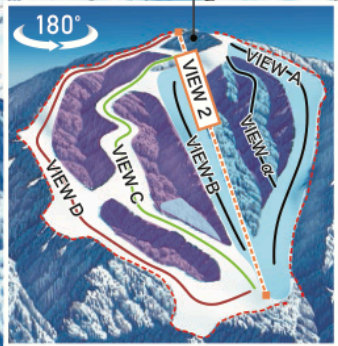

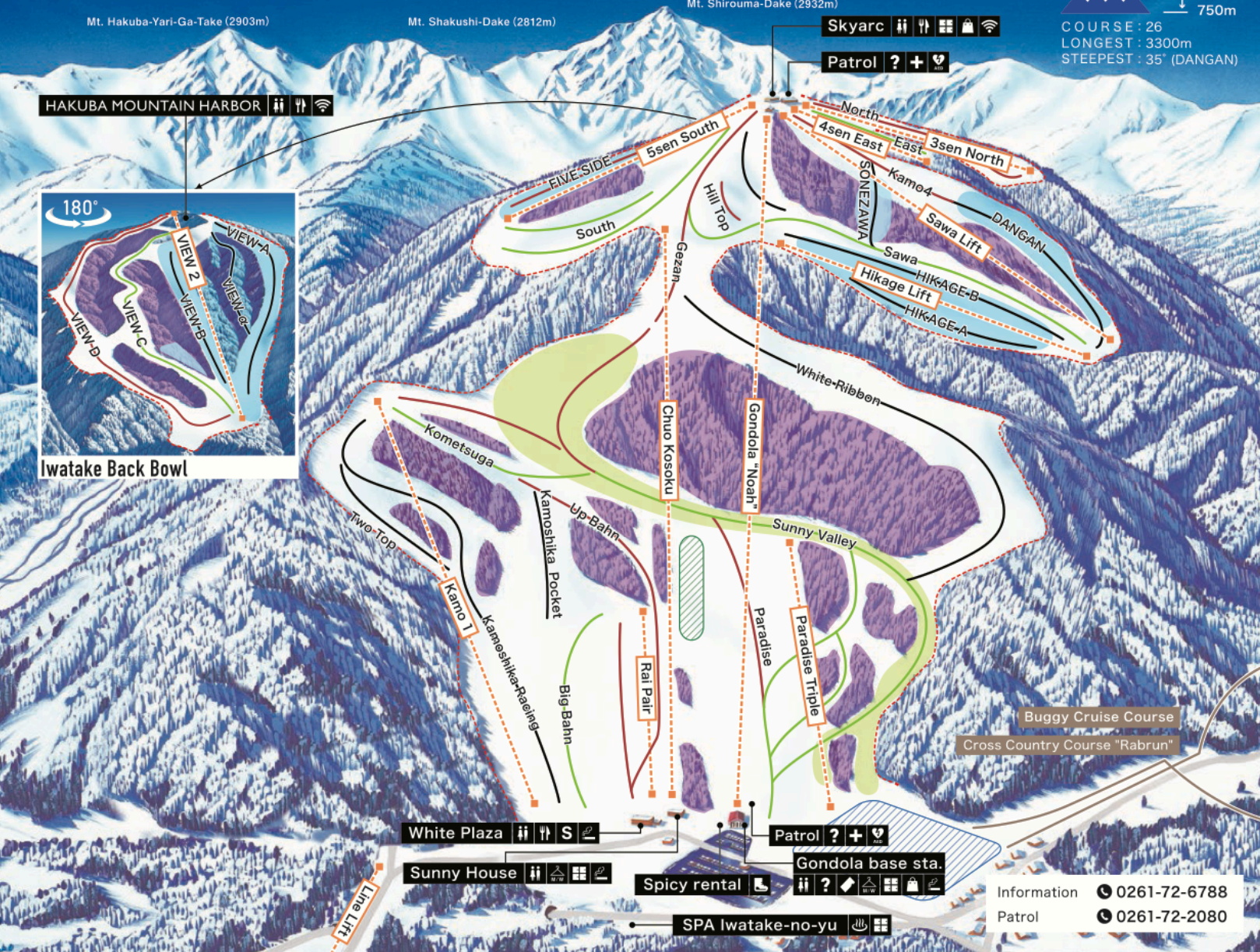

Hakuba Iwatake Snow Field Rules & Regulations

- For everyone who enjoys our ski resort, please follow the rules & regulations written below.
- It is prohibited to enter "No Skiing Zone", outside of marked or closed trails. You will be responsible for all expenses if any accident occurs outside of ski resort boundaries that requires search or rescue operations.
 - Skiing and snowboarding outside the ski resort boundaries is strictly prohibited. Avalanches can be easily triggered. Missed trails as well as climbing slips or rock slides may occur in this area. Prohibited area is out of our management, rescue operation or searches from the ski area cannot be made if you are outside of the marked trails.
 - Please observe all posted signs, signboard, ropes and follow the instructions of the Ski Patrol.
 - Be aware of changing mountain weather as well as snow conditions. Always stay in control.
 - Please check your equipment before skiing/snowboarding.
 - It is the responsibility of all guests to consider not only their own safety, but also the safety of others, at all times.
 - If you are not sure of which areas are "No Skiing Zones", then please ask for instructions from the Ski Patrol. Violators will be asked to leave the ski resort immediately and no refund will be made regardless of any reasons.

Alpine Responsibility Code of Conduct

- Do not harm or threaten other people.
- Control your speed according to circumstances, such as the terrain, weather, snow quality, skiing skills, physical condition and congestion, so you can easily stop anytime to avoid danger.
- Take care not to interfere with people skiing in front of you.
- When overtaking other people, keep a sufficient distance from them.
- When starting to ski, joining other people or crossing across a slope, carefully look upslope to ensure your safety.
- Do not sit on a course. Refrain from stopping in a narrow area or an area with poor visibility. If you fall down, quickly clear space for other skiers.
- When climbing, walking and stopping, use the edge of the course.
- Attach flow stoppers to your skis or snowboard.
- Observe precautions given by notices, signs and announcements, and follow instructions from Ski Patrol and Ski Resort Staff.
- If an accident occurs, cooperate with relief operations reporting, and disclose your identity regardless of whether you are a person involved in the accident or a witness.
